## International students and visa integrity

- Poor practices increase the risk of:
  - overseas students not set up for success
  - students being exploited
  - undermining Australia's reputation for quality education
- This has significant potential to undermine trust in Australian higher education



## International students and visa integrity

- TEQSA has observed significant risks within the higher education sector
- There will be ongoing monitoring and focus
- Providers should ensure oversight arrangements are strong, compliant and appropriately monitored



## Student protests on campus

### TEQSA's approach to date

- Ongoing monitoring since October 2023
- TEQSA established Regulatory Response group as situation escalated. This group is still meeting
- Direct engagement with providers with protest activity
- Letters to providers sent 10 May and 5 June 2024



## Student protests on campus

#### Further considerations

- Protest activities and encampments have decreased but ongoing leadership focus, and resourcing will be needed
- Events in the Middle East and protest activity on campus will have continued impact
- Ongoing risk of provocation, discrimination and vilification needs to be monitored and actively managed

## **TEQSA's regulatory strategy**

- New strategy to guide TEQSA's future regulatory approach
- Comprehensive engagement
- Expected timeline: 12-18 months
